Height clearance Ngauranga Stock Effluent Disposal Site

Purpose

This advisory update the status of the tunnel height under the SH1 Wellington Motorway that leads to the Ngauranga Stock Effluent Disposal (SED) site.

What operators can do

The tunnel floor has been milled and surveyed by Waka Kotahi New Zealand Transport Agency and there is vertical clearance ranging from 4.42 metres (m) to 4.55m, therefore the tunnel can now accommodate a stock crate at the maximum legal height of 4.3m.

However, until it can be replaced a sign "MAXIMUM CLEARANCE 4.275m" remains displayed at the tunnel entrance.



I appreciate you will have drivers that may be reluctant to use the tunnel given the outdated sign and this is a matter you will need to consider before determining what action you wish to take given the new information.
