Managing risk of fuel price increases

Purpose

This advisory provides advice to operators on managing the risk associated with fuel price volatility. The cost is approaching double what it was 12 months ago and the current geopolitical situation is likely to add more stress on international supply.

- Use information such as the Grant Thornton Index information to help understand the trends in typical transport cost components
- Review your fuel purchasing practices
- Review the relationship and contract terms with your fuel supplier
- Consider the relationship with your customers and the terms of your supply contract and how those factors accommodate price volatility
