


## **Constitutional Restructure Proposal (one page summary)**


Transporting New Zealand is updating its constitution and governance structure (**the restructure**). This is being done to ensure compliance with the new Incorporated Societies Act 2022, simplify our complicated existing organisational structure, and ensure Transporting New Zealand is focussed on member priorities. The restructure would replace Transporting New Zealand's four regional associations with a single national membership structure.


## CURRENT STRUCTURE
